Job duties in Florida Congressional offices include attending hearings, drafting reports and legislative updates, as well as supporting special projects, events, and essential front-line constituent relations. Successful candidates are detail-oriented, self-starters, and have a passion for civic engagement and the intersection of policy and politics.

This is an in-person internship and requires a time commitment of 40 hours per week.

All currently enrolled undergraduate academic majors are encouraged to apply. A minimum of a 3.0 GPA is required for this internship. Preference given to Junior and Senior standing students with at least one semester completed at UF.
